On a separate sheet of paper 8 ½" x 11" minimum please provide a sketch illustrating the location of the fence. Include property lines and adjacent streets, alleys, etc., with dimensions. Owner is responsible for determining property lines and location of fence.

- Fences shall be no more than the height permitted by the zoning district.
- Masonry walls require submittal of section showing footing and structural detail. A building permit is required.
- Walls and fences exceeding the maximum limit of 6' 6" will require approval for a variance from the Board of Adjustment. A building permit is required.
- No barbed wire fences are allowed in the City limits. Also, razor wire and/or concertina wire shall be prohibited, except for prisons and/or directly related correctional facilities, which shall require a conditional use permit.
- Owner is responsible for accuracy of property lines. A survey may be necessary to determine exact location.
- If constructing a fence on a common property line, the affected party's consent will be required.

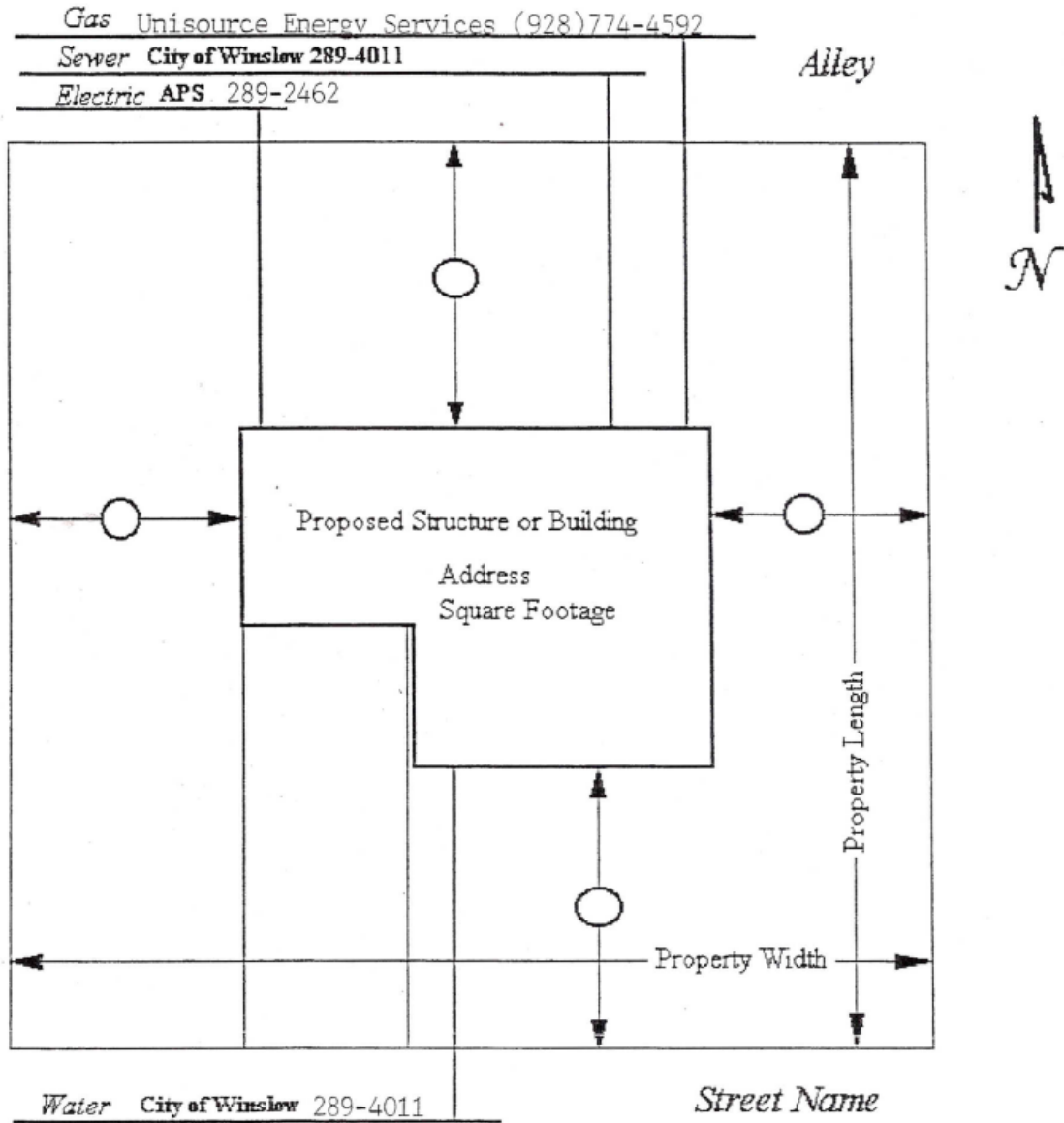
